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

## VISIT TO MAHATMA GANDHI HOSPITAL


methods such as mnemonics, flowcharts, and mind maps to improve memory retention.





The talk was highly informative and motivated students to view pharmacovigilance not only as a career option but also as a social responsibility towards patient safety and rational drug use.



The event aimed to showcase the importance of pharmacists as healthcare professionals and to spread awareness about their contribution to society.




## PHARMACOGNOSY DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITY “TRANSVERSE SECTION COMPETITION 2025”




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## PHARMACEUTICAL CHEMISTRY DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITY “CHEM-QUIZOPHILE 2025”

Students observed the systematic storage of crude drugs. The staff explained the importance of the Certificate of Analysis (COA) for every batch of raw herb arriving at the facility. The facility demonstrated a seamless blend of traditional Ayurveda and modern engineering like Pulverization, Converting raw herbs into fine powders (*Churnas*), extraction, the use of large-scale extractors



to obtain active phytoconstituents. The experts demonstrated Physico-chemical testing like Ash value, extractive value, and moisture content, HPTLC. The technical staff at S. G. Phyto Pharma engaged in a Q&A session with the students that cover. The visit was highly educational for the students of Women's College of Pharmacy, Peth Vadgaon. It provided a clear vision of how Ayurvedic principles are validated by modern science. The experience reinforced the classroom teachings on extraction, standardization, and Good Manufacturing Practices. The visit provided a comprehensive bridge between textbook Ayurvedic pharmacology and industrial reality. It highlighted that while the formulas remain ancient, the standardization and safety protocols are cutting-edge.


## MEDICINAL PLANT GARDEN VISIT

On **January 8, 2026**, Women's College of Pharmacy, Peth Vadgaon, organized a guided visit to the medicinal plant garden visit of Ashokrao Mane Ayurvedic Medical College Wathar.

The visit aimed to provide students with a practical perspective on **Pharmacognosy** and the identification of medicinal flora used in the pharmaceutical industry.

Students identified various medicinal herbs, shrubs, and trees, focusing on their morphological characteristics such as leaf shape, phyllotaxy, and floral features.

Faculty members provided insights into the **botanical names, families, and the specific active chemical constituents** (like alkaloids, glycosides, and volatile oils) present in each plant.



The visit covered the therapeutic uses of common plants like *Aloe vera* (skin care/laxative), *Ocimum sanctum* (immunity/respiratory), and *Adhatoda vasica* (expectorant).

Students learned about the importance of maintaining a "Living Herbarium" for research and the preservation of rare medicinal species.

The visit was a successful educational experience, effectively bridging the gap between theoretical textbook descriptions and real-world botanical identification. It enhanced the students' understanding of natural drug sources, which is vital for their future roles as pharmacists



# REPORT ON WATER TREATMENT PLANT VISIT

Womens college of Pharmacy students have visited water treatment plant on 8/01/2026 with Staff from water purification unit welcomes the students and staff. Then they explain entire process about water purification like location from which water is collected various processes to be done on water for purification. The major source of drinking water is tank, from where water is pumped to the filtration Plant. Treatment process: In treatment process water is mixed with bleaching powder and Alum to kill the pathogens Coagulate particle. During coagulation, chemical with positive charge added to water. Positive charge will neutralize negative charge and dissolve particle in water. After coagulation process flocculation process is done. In flocculation gentle mixing of water to form larger and heavier particle are formed. In sedimentation process, solid particles are removed from water because of their heavy mass and Gravitational force acting on them. Once



floccules have settled to bottom of the water, the clear water is on top, is filtered to separate additional solid from water. During filtration, the clear water is passes through filter that have different pore size and are made of different material (sand, gravel & charcoal). This filer remove dissolved particles, dust, parasites, viruses and bacteria. Activated carbon filters also removed bad odor. After filtration of water, disinfectant Bleaching powder, Chloramines are mixed with water to kill any bacteria or viruses. Disinfectant level should keep low to avoid any problem to mankind. Water is stored in big reservoir to supply it to society Water purification plant Provides clean and reusable water, Protect environment, and Prevents people from water-borne diseases. During this visit, students understood entire treatment process and the importance of water and the distribution system. Our staff thanked their staff for cooperation. All students and staff returned to college at 3.00 PM.




## PARENT MEET





**charge**. The introduction of the guest was given by **Ms. Arya Bhandari, Third Year B. Pharmacy student**.


